Call to Order 1.

President McAllaster called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. All members were present. President McAllaster announced that all open sessions of the board meeting are audio-recorded and may capture the sounds of those participating in the meeting. President McAllaster asked those participating in the meeting to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Special Presentation 5.

Myiesha Majors, Chairperson of the African American Parent & Educator Advisory Committee (AAPEAC), presented on behalf of AAPEAC. She introduced her executive board: Tawni Flot-Williams, Vice Chairwoman; Nicole Edun, Secretary; Jeannie Tavalozzi, Assistant Superintendent of Instruction/ Pupil Services; Damita Walton, Director of Personnel Services; and Justin Kooyman, Director of Instruction. Ms. Majors outlined AAPEAC's purpose, shared the committee's 2023-24 goals and accomplishments, and discussed their goals for 2024-25.

Board members expressed gratitude to the program and requested a copy of the AAPEAC Voice.

Instruction

Alicia Lyon, Director of Pupil Services, presented information regarding the updated open and closed programs and student transfers during the 2024-2025 school year.
