# 1. Call to Order

President Taylor called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. When the meeting was called to order, all members were present. President Taylor announced that all open sessions of the board meeting are video and audio recorded and may capture sounds and images of those participating in the meeting. President Taylor asked those participating in the meeting to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### 2. Public Comment on Agenda Items

Pursuant to Board Policy 9324, Board Minutes and Recordings: "The minutes shall reflect the names of those individuals who comment during the meeting's public comment period as well as the topics they address."

- A. Comments on agenda items:
  - Mathew Gordon commented regarding collective bargaining, staff benefits, and salaries.

#### 3. Review / Adopt Agenda and Minutes

- A. The Board of Trustees adopted the agenda as presented on a motion by Member Long, seconded by Member Cadman and carried by a unanimous vote, with all members present voting yes.
- B. The Board of Trustees took action to adopt the minutes of the regular meeting held September 8, 2022, as presented on a motion by Member Garcia, seconded by Member Karsch and carried by a unanimous vote, with all members present voting yes.

#### 4. Educational Presentation

A. Kerry Hackman, Principal of Etiwanda Colony, Christine Reed, Teaching Vice Principal, and Desiree Clark, Teacher, presented "Colony Cubs: Our Paws Keep Reaching for Success!" Ms. Hackman shared 2022-23 i-Ready fall diagnostic data. Ms. Reed provided an update on Universal Access time and positive behavior expectations on campus. Ms. Clark presented the performing arts program, and students shared what they like about performing arts and working with Ms. Clark.

#### 5. Instruction

A. Assistant Superintendent, Jeannie Tavolazzi, reported that the Etiwanda School District has met the requirement for compliance with Education Code section 60422(a) and California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 5, Section 9531(a) regarding amended Education Code 60119, to determine that the Etiwanda School District has sufficient textbooks and instructional materials for the 2022-2023 school year. Ms. Tavolazzi recommended the approval of Resolution No. 2223-18 regarding the sufficiency of textbooks and instructional materials. President Taylor then opened the Public Hearing regarding the Sufficiency of Textbooks and called for comments. After hearing no comments, President Taylor closed public hearing.

The Board of Trustees then took action to approve Resolution No. 2223-18 on a motion by Member Long, seconded by Member Karsch and carried by a unanimous vote, with all members present voting yes.

#### 7. Business and Legal

- A. Doug Claflin, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, presented the 2022-23 Facilities and Measure I Project Plan for the Etiwanda School District, including information on area development, student projections, classroom projections, funding, projects, and recommendations.
  - Member Taylor commented on the incredible amount of incoming students and limited amount of space around Falcon Ridge. She asked about the rules for obtaining money to provide schools for those students. Mr. Claflin shared that the difficulty comes in the timing of everything. Apartment complexes can be released all at once and open faster than single-family dwellings. The money will be received; it will be a matter of how fast the district will have to move to accommodate the new students.
  - Member Karsch asked about Measure I. Mr. Claffin shared we have \$57 million and will share the preliminary plans for building during board meetings.
  - Member Karsch asked what the factor is for new students for the proposed apartment complexes. Mr. Claflin said it is a generation factor of .0348.

After discussion, the Board of Trustees took action to approve the 2022-23 Facilities and Measure I Project Plan as presented, on a motion by Member Long, seconded by Member Karsch and carried by a unanimous vote, with all members present voting yes.
